



**SARDINIA SAILING CUP
WINGFOIL RACING WORLD CUP SARDINIA
DAY 4, GREAT RACES IN THE SEA OF CAGLIARI
SUNDAY, OCTOBER 20, GOLDEN TICKET AND MEDAL SERIES LIVE STREAMING**

Cagliari – The race towards victory in the WingFoil Racing World Cup Sardinia, the World Cup stage of WingFoil hosted by the Poetto sea, is intensifying.

Today, October 19, eight races were held for both women and men, crucial competitions in which the names of the nine athletes who will compete in the Medal Series tomorrow were confirmed.

But first, there will be the Golden Ticket race: the winner will get the "golden ticket" to join the top 10.

On Sunday, October 20, the races will be live-streamed on the YouTube and Facebook pages of "WingFoil Racing," with technical commentary in English by Mirco Babini, coordinator of the Sardinia Sailing Cup and president of the IWSA, alongside American speaker Chris Museler from IWSA.

The awards ceremony for the WingFoil Racing World Cup Sardinia will take place on Sunday, October 20 at 5:00 PM at the amphitheater in Marina Piccola.

Day 4, the results.

"It was a tough day," commented French athlete Manon Pianazza, who leads the women's standings. "We had a lot of races, and it was fun to compete in the water with the other girls. I'm happy to be leading this competition."

She is followed by Italian Maddalena Spanu (Young Azzurra - YCCS) and Spaniard Nia Suardiaz. Other athletes already qualified for the Medal Series are Poland's Karolina Kluszczyńska, Italian Charlotte Baruzzi (Reef ASD), Greece's Emilia Kosti, and Marta Monge (Circolo Nautico del Finale). Rounding out the list are Spain's Iset Segura and France's Orane Ceris. Leading the men's standings is Poland's Kamil Manowiecki, followed by Frenchman Mathis Ghio, who continues his strong performance in the men's competition: "I'm happy to be in Sardinia, and here I'm trying to confirm last year's results." Third is Italian Francesco Cappuzzo (Reef ASD), followed by Alessandro Jose Tomasi (Fraglia Vela Riva ASD): "I tried to hold my position in the rankings, and we battled hard during today's races," he commented. The ranking features a strong presence of both French and Italian athletes. In fifth is Julien Rattotti, followed by Italian Nicolò Spanu (Windsurfing Club Cagliari) and Frenchman Mateo Dussars. Completing the Medal list are Luca Franchi (Yacht Club Italiano) and another French athlete, Oscar Lecler.
